Daniel Hillel was born in the United States but moved to Israel as a child where he was raised on a farming kibbutz. Educated at both American and Israeli universities as a soil scientist, he went on to develop micro-irrigation techniques that dramatically improved water efficiency and agricultural output in arid regions. He has been consulted on sustainable agriculture techniques by more than 30 countries and has written or edited 26 books on the roles of soil and water in healthy agro-ecosystems. Recently he has been working on ways to adjust agricultural techniques to adapt to increasing water stress resulting from climate change. He is the current laureate of the World Food Prize, which has been described as the “Nobel Prize of Agriculture.”
